The Great Questions

Great Literature as well as great art of all cultures usually deals with one or more of the following questions:

I. What is the nature of the universe--the cosmos?

- Is the universe hostile/beneficent/indifferent to humanity?
- What is the nature of evil? What is the source of evil?
- Why, if God is just, does He allow evil to exist? (the problem of evil)
- Why, if God is just, does He allow the good to suffer? (the problem of pain)

II. What is God's relationship to humans? What is the nature of God?

Does God Exist?

Is God by inclination an angry God?

Is God the creator

Is God concerned about humanity?

Is God indifferent to humanity?

 Should humans fear/obey/sacrifice to/ pray/propriciate to God? ...a proud God?

...a jealous God? ...a kind God?

Is God all good?

Does God himself bring evil to Humanity and cause suffering?

III. What is the nature of human beings?

- Are humans basically good/evil?
- Are people determined or does free will exist?
- Are people more divine than other animals?
- Are people degraded, corrupt--more animal than spirit?
- Do people represent a balance (between two opposing forces)? If so, how is this balance preserved?
- What is a human being's greatest faculty--reason or imagination?
- Do humans have a soul? Can they achieve or be granted immortality? How or under what protocol?
- Are humans in the universe by design? By chance? What leads one to this conclusion?
- What is a human being's basic purpose in life? Is that purpose consistent to all human beings? How are
 physical/biological needs and abilities considered in this purpose? What about emotional and/or spiritual
 needs?
- What constitutes the good life for humans?
- How can an individual's and/or a community's life gain significance?
- How can people give value to their lives?
- How can the individual find the greatest satisfaction, completeness, fulfillment?
- How do people properly establish values? Ethics? Morals? What is or should be the basis for this?

IV. What is the relationship of one human to another?

- Are all people to be treated as equals?
- On what basis or using what criteria do we evaluate our fellow human beings?
- Are we basically social or single individuals?
- How are we to establish an orderly existence with other human beings?
- Under what social or governmental system can people most properly function?
- What is the "ideal" or "good" society? How can it be established?
- On what basis would we regulate our association with other people?
